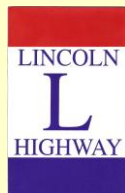
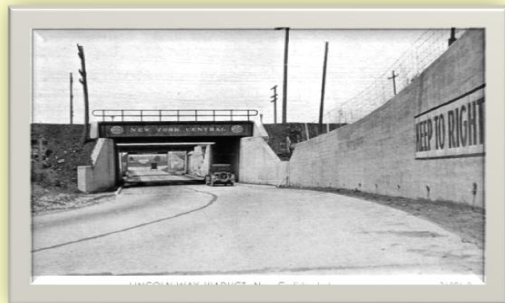


Join us for the INLHA fall event on Saturday, October 11, 2008 *Lincoln Highway Day in New Carlisle!*



Historic New Carlisle Inc. is teaming up with the Indiana Lincoln Highway Association Inc. to celebrate the original route of the Lincoln Highway through New Carlisle.

The Indiana LHA received grant funds from the national LHA to underwrite the fabrication of two Lincoln Highway interpretive kiosks. Kiosks will be placed in Warsaw and in New Carlisle. Historic New Carlisle Inc. coordinated the New Carlisle project that will add historical interest to the downtown shopping district. The kiosks will share the heritage of the Lincoln Highway with thousands of visitors each year. Special street banners will be displayed in celebration of this event. A reception will follow the dedication at the Old Republic until 4 p.m. Come along to enjoy a house tour and refreshments. The Gift Shop will be open and LH merchandise will be for sale. Lincoln Highway memorabilia will be on exhibit.
